We started Purpose in Motion over ten years ago with a simple but ambitious goal: to support young people who are driving social change. Back then, social entrepreneurship wasn't yet mainstream. It wasn't taught in schools, and few believed it could be a viable path. So we learned by doing — we experimented, stumbled, grew, and kept going.

Since those early days, we've built social innovation programs for more than 13,000 youth across 110+countries and helped mobilize over US \$850,000 to fund youth-led social ventures. Along the way, we noticed a pattern: brilliant ideas were everywhere —but access wasn't.

If you have the right background, the right contacts, or the right pedigree, opportunities tend to find you. But for so many others with just as much passion and creativity, it's a fight simply to be seen. In 2025, we launched our own InnovImpact Incubator to change that — to support changemakers from every background, as long as they are building things that matter.

Four entrepreneurial teams from around the world joined us. In Latin America, one is using AI to help farmers grow more and waste less. In Madagascar, another turns discarded coconut shells into clean-burning fuel, reducing deforestation and improving health. In Sierra Leone, a team transforms waste into affordable, eco-friendly housing materials. And in the United States, one team is reinventing cleaning and waste management for a greener future.

As a social enterprise that was neither venture-backed nor corporate-funded, building an incubator was not easy. The idea was born at a retreat where we gathered our team and key partners to explore what was most needed. To bring it to life, we leaned on our community of mentors, interviewed dozens of stakeholders, and knocked on virtual doors for support.

When Demo Day — held virtually — came, we set out to recreate the energy of real-world networking: crafting meaningful connections and linking prizes that could open new doors. It was a spotlight on founders who aren't building to win, but to make something better — to create a new vision of what's possible.

As times change, PIM is evolving too. While our core programs remain — including a revamp of our social impact training through a new partnership with the Qi Center on the year-long Fellows for Change fellowship — we are also exploring new paths forward. In this next phase, we'll draw even more deeply on our community and embrace a more flexible structure for collaboration.

We've come to see the power of what we call the Constellation Effect — when each person in our community shines in their own right, and together we illuminate something far greater than any one star could on its own.

And we are thrilled to keep building this constellation — alongside all of you.

The 2024 Tech4Good Global Competition brought together 12 exceptional teams selected from over 950 students across more than 100 countries. These top teams, chosen through regional Tech4Good programs, participated in an intensive accelerator program that spanned across Beijing and Shenzhen.

This year's Tech4Good competition showcased remarkable innovations, with Ethiopia's EarlyVet winning Gold, UAE's Beyond Limits taking Silver, and Ireland's Anaphero securing both Bronze and the People's Choice Award.

The week-long journey began in Beijing where teams engaged in specialized workshops focused on product development, market validation, testing methodologies, and feedback implementation.

Activities included hands-on challenges like the marshmallow tower construction (won by Team Ethiopia with an impressive 126 cm structure) and the egg drop experiment using only straws.

Midweek, all participants traveled from Beijing to Shenzhen, where they continued refining their business models and market validation strategies.

The accelerator program culminated in a final pitch competition on April 11th in Shenzhen, where teams presented their technology solutions addressing critical social and environmental challenges to a distinguished panel of judges.

TechImpact Ideathon



Building on the success of our TechImpact Academy, we created the TechImpact Ideathon to share our approach with a wider community of changemakers. This collaborative online event brought our alumni—teams who continued developing their ventures after completing the intensive Tech4Good program—together with aspiring social entrepreneurs eager to make their mark.

Participants dove into a dynamic ideation sprint, confronting the same complex challenges our Tech4Good students tackle during the full program. Guided by our experienced mentors in breakout sessions, they brainstormed innovative, technologyenabled solutions to address critical social and environmental issues. The event concluded with teams presenting their concepts to a panel of alumni judges, who selected the most promising idea for exclusive prizes. The Ideathon demonstrated the power of peer learning while creating a pipeline of engaged future participants.

CSO Hackathon

The National Civil Society Organizations (CSO) Hackathon which took place from July 16 to 18, 2025 in Rabat, Morocco brought together over 80 participants representing 39 projects from more than 12 regions across Morocco. The objective was to empower civil society organizations with tools and methods in social innovation and digital transformation, while co-creating impactful solutions to community-based challenges.

The Hackathon was led by two experienced facilitators, Ilyass Benarouia and Karim Kanoute, from PIM to support CSOs through a series of training sessions that emphasize social innovation, technology, and digitalization. The program covered 5 main areas to support participants to understand their role in addressing social challenges, and eventually to generate an innovative solution at their workplace and pitch their ideas on the last day of the program.

The Talent Development Flagship Project in collaboration with Seeds for the Future brought together exceptional young minds for an intensive week of learning, innovation, and cross-cultural collaboration. This flagship initiative delivered on the program's mission to develop local talent, share knowledge, increase ICT sector awareness, and foster digital community building on a global scale.

Over the course of the week, students engage in a comprehensive training curriculum (5G, Cloud Computing, and Artificial Intelligence), visited various strategic sites to explore technology's role in achieving sustainable governance (Smart Government, UNDP SDG Innovation Lab, Tencent, and DJI), and engage with industry experts through a roundtable event.

We successfully hosted 7 cohorts in South China with young talent hailing from all over Europe, Northern Africa, the Middle East & Central Asia, Asia-Pacific, and Southern Africa.







In 2025, PIM launched our brand new InnovImpact Incubator (III) is designed for startups and social enterprises that are ready to move beyond the prototype stage and validate their solutions in real-world markets. III supports ventures that have a clear startup concept, a developed business model, and prior pitching experience, and are now focused on refining, testing, and preparing their product or service for the next steps. The III Incubator consisted of over 4 months of intensive mentorship and training culminating into a global Demo Day and Award Ceremony with cash and in-kind prizes and awards.


Mentorship

Demo Day



On July 12, Purpose in Motion hosted our InnovImpact Incubator's very first Demo Day, which was a dynamic showcase of bold ideas, global collaboration, and social innovation. Four early-stage social enterprises from Latin America, Africa, and North America presented their tech-driven solutions to some of the world's most pressing sustainability challenges.

Our event opened with remarks from PIM Co-Founder Jasmine Lau. Following the opening remarks was an insightful fireside chat with investors and ecosystem leaders about the future of innovation and social impact. After the fireside chat, each startup then delivered a 4-minute pitch to explain the SDG challenges they're tackling, their solutions, and their visions to a brighter future. After each startup team delivered their 4-minute pitch, a panel of distinguished industry experts shared their comments and feedback with the startup teams.

We then went into separate breakout rooms where audience members, prospective investors, industry experts, mentors, and PIM community members had a chance to engage directly with each startup team to learn more about their vision and startup.

Following the interactive breakout room session was an announcement for special prizes from our distinguished prize sponsors, and then culminating to the reveal of our "People's Choice Award" winner, which went to "Agro-Data Connect! (Latin America) who is helping smallholder farmers make data-informed decisions by providing accessible, Alpowered agricultural insights!

MODEL FOUNDATION: SEO CHINA | PUBLIC LEADERSHIP CAMP



The SEO China Public Leadership Camp is a comprehensive program aimed at equipping underserved college students with membership and problem-solving skills, as well as the opportunity to make a meaningful impact on a social issue. PIM organized this program in collaboration with SEO China for the ninth year in a row with a 2-day bootcamp to equip students with the skills to research local organizations working in the field of youth employment and career development in China. Students have to come up with an evaluation and due diligence report. The program culminated in a presentation to the investment committee, where students presented their findings and competed for a chance to win grant funding of 50,000 RMB for their organization.

FELLOWSHIP FOR CHANGE (FFC)

Program Introduction

In 2025, PIM launched an exciting new partnership with the Qi Social Innovation Center to co-organize the Fellowship for Change (FFC). Through this year-long program, PIM mentors Leslie Dong, Kenny Leung, and Jane Li are guiding 18 high school Fellows from across China to deepen their social innovation mindset and develop meaningful projects addressing some of today's most urgent challenges.

In August, we completed the first FFC Summit, where PIM mentors traveled to Beijing to lead an immersive training experience for the Fellows. Throughout the summit, students developed core skills in design thinking, human-centered design, systems thinking, investigative research, and interview techniques. The summit concluded with each Fellow delivering a three-minute presentation outlining their research topic and next steps.

This milestone marks the beginning of an inspiring year-long learning journey. In addition to two in-person summits, Fellows will also receive ongoing online mentorship throughout the year to support their research, project development, and personal learning goals. Over the coming months, they will continue shaping their projects, refining their ideas, and strengthening their capacity to address real social and environmental challenges.

Looking ahead, Fellows will gather again in February 2026 in Kunming for Summit 2, where they will ideate and prototype their solutions. They will then finalize their research and prepare for implementation during Summit 3 in August 2026.


In August, we completed the first FFC summit, where PIM mentors traveled to Beijing to guide 18 Fellows in strengthening their social innovation skills.

Over the course of the summit, students engaged in design thinking, human-centered design, systems thinking, investigative research, and interview skills, culminating in 3-minute presentations outlining their research plans and next steps.

This milestone marks the beginning of an inspiring year-long journey where students will deepen their capacity to tackle pressing social and environmental challenges while preparing to launch impactful community projects.

In February 2026, fellows will be attending Summit 2 in Kunming where they will ideate and prototype their ideas. And in August 2026, fellows will be finalizing their research projects at Summit 3.

Online Sessions



In partnership with Qi Social Innovation Center, PIM hosted two online learning sessions in 2025 to support Fellows in deepening their systems thinking and research-to-impact skills beyond the offline summits.

On September 28, Fellows participated in a Systems Mapping Workshop, exploring how to clarify research plans, prioritize key questions, and apply the Impact Gap Canvas to their projects. Through a hands-on case study, participants collaboratively developed systems maps, gaining practical tools to identify stakeholders and refine their change-making strategies.

On November 23, the session From Research to Impact: Extracting Data Insights guided Fellows through transforming research findings into actionable insights. Mentors supported them in reframing problems, identifying opportunities, and completing the Impact Gaps Canvas to translate data into meaningful impact.

These online engagements reinforced continuous learning and collaboration within the Fellow community, with more sessions planned for 2026.

In 2025, PIM established a new partnership with the Qi Social Innovation Center through the Venture For Change (VFC) program — a global social entrepreneurship education initiative for students in grades 7–12, developed in collaboration with the Columbia Organization of Rising Entrepreneurs.


Rooted in leading social enterprise curricula from Columbia Business School and Yale School of Management, VFC empowers young changemakers to apply "business for good" principles to real-world challenges through online learning, case studies, mentorship, and pitch presentations.

As part of this collaboration, PIM mentors contribute their expertise in Social Enterprise Financial Planning, guiding students through hands-on workshops on financial modeling to assess the sustainability of their business models. Mentors also provide live pitch coaching and review of student reports and pitch decks, helping participants refine their ideas and strengthen their social impact strategies.

Launch for Good: Masterclass for Social Entrepreneurs


